We continue to work closely with the 3 ROTC Commands within USF to develop a strategy for the establishment of a Joint Curriculum. We are continuing to research the compare/contrast of service ROTC curriculums for college juniors and seniors in order to find areas of commonality for possible consolidation or cooperation. Our Graduate Assistant researched multicultural education in higher education institutions, assisted in the research of college international/diplomacy programs and certifications, discussed curriculums with various military college programs (VMI, TAMI, Citadel, USMA, USAFA, USNA, ...), and researched systems theory to better understand implications of proposed curriculum changes.

On Thursday, 27 October 2005, the Director met with various National Defense University (NDU) Representatives at Ft. McNair, Washington, DC: Professor Skeets Meyer, Dr. James Keagle, and Dr. Thom Terwilliger, to develop a plan for the implementation of a Joint Course at USF. On Friday, 28, October 2005, the same group from NDU met with Dr. Gilroy, Director of Accession Policy, and Mr. Clark from the Office of the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Military Personnel Policy, to brief them on our curriculum development strategy. After much discussion, Dr. Gilroy asked USF if they are interested in developing a National Security Policy and Strategy Baccalaureate Degree. In addition, it was strongly recommended that the "team" continue to develop a course or plan that would apply the "Pre-Commissioning Joint Education" requirements as outlined in the CJCSI 1800.01B as a "pilot" program for USF. We will continue to develop the course content by identifying the "core course commonalities" within the 3 ROTC Services curriculum and develop a series of topics for a "joint" course that could be applied as one unit or in a series of topics throughout their years in ROTC. In the meantime, USF will review and assess its interest in a National Security Policy and Strategy Baccalaureate Degree.
